Message from Rev. Diane Rollert

Where O Where is our Minister?

I’ll be on the road a lot this month. On May 7, I’ll be in Sturbridge, Massachusetts, to participate in a workshop led by Dan Hotchkiss, author of *Governance and Ministry*. On May 8, I will participate in a service of recognition for my dear friend and mentor, the Rev. Gary Smith, senior minister of the First Parish in Concord, Massachusetts. Gary is retiring after more than 30 years as a Unitarian Universalist minister.

In honour of Gary’s ministry, First Parish has set up a legacy fund for student ministers and will celebrate its role as a teaching congregation on May 8. On that day, I will have the honour of speaking about the many years that Gary served as my mentor while I was a religious educator at First Parish and during my years in seminary. Over the years, I have learned many things from Gary: to seek the holy in each moment; to lighten up and laugh, and to accept that everything comes in its own time.

Gary is truly a minister’s minister.

Later in the month, over Victoria Day Weekend, a large group of our members will be headed to Toronto for the Canadian Unitarian Council’s Annual Conference and Meeting (CUC-ACM). The group includes our four delegates, Carol Cumming Speirs, Kirstin McKeown, Margo Ellis and Marlo Turner-Ritchie, who will represent us during the CUC business meeting. At least another 8 members will be joining us for the conference. This is the 50th anniversary of the CUC, and I am thrilled that Montreal will be so well represented.

On Saturday, May 21, I will deliver the *Confluence Lecture* during the main conference.

Each year, one Unitarian minister is chosen by peers to lecture on something of importance to our movement. In my case, I've decided to focus on the challenges we will be facing in a post-secular world. Where do we stand in a world that is becoming increasingly religious and anti-religious at the same time? I'll share some of the ideas and thoughts I've been developing for my lecture during the service on May 15.

After the CUC-ACM, the Unitarian Universalist Ministers of Canada will conduct their week-long business meeting and retreat. Since we are scattered across such a vast land, this is an important time for us to reconnect, share wisdom and support each other in our ministries.

I will return on May 29, with friend and colleague Rev. Brian Kiely, minister of the Unitarian Church of Edmonton and president of the International Council of Unitarians and Universalists. Although he is originally from Montreal, the Edmonton congregation and his international duties keep him far from our city. This is a rare opportunity to have Brian join us as our guest preacher. I know that it will be good for both of us to be home again.

swim team, where he took a silver medal in backstroke at last year’s Jeux de Montréal competition. Way to go, Lowik!
