Message from the Treasurer Church Operating Costs Increasing

An early estimate for the cost of running our church and its activities in 2011 is \$342,000, representing an increase of 2%. This level of expense represents an average of more than \$2100 per existing contributor, after allowing for revenues from other sources.

Notes from DRE Caroline Balderston Parry

An inspiring summer

My summer weeks away from Montreal have been very rich, and I'm returning for my third year as Director of Religious Education, feeling greatly refreshed.

I began my time away by running a program for 7 & 8 year olds for six mornings at a Quaker gathering in Ohio. The children came from disparate states and Quaker meetings, and so most didn't know one another previously. Nor did I know them, but I loved the opportunity to work closely with children and their parents, plus volunteer staff, in a consistent, day-after-day manner - something our Montreal life attendance patterns do not permit. The gathering-wide theme was "Accepting Gifts of the Spirit", and I received many. Plus I was delighted to teach my staff and children our UU hymn:

*From you I receive,
to you I give;
together we share,
and by this we live.*

This song quickly became well-loved. As so often happens, there's an easy overlap between Quaker and UU attitudes.

I saw this sense of our common territory borne out in the words of a British friend and [Quaker] teacher who had come to learn from this North American conference, too. He spoke of "Spirituality as an awareness of what's deepest within us," and how our task is

"to seek to accompany children, always being person-centered." He emphasized that simply "how we are with children is what helps them develop spiritually and become fully who THEY are."

I was inspired and want to extend an invitation to YOU to get involved on that level with our young people this year! Please contact me or RE Committee members if you're interested in further exploration.
